Legislative Committee

A new bill on self-neglect has been passed which will provides new criteria to trigger an investigation for elder abuse. There was a brief discussion about how this could help avoid a situation like the one brought to our attention by Sheriff Pat Perez where a senior in Elgin was evicted from her home. Roger and Pam Sebern will look into how our group can assist to coordinate appropriate services.

Paula Wiener from the Alexian Brothers Neurosciences Institute spoke about understanding Parkinsons Disease.
